### Tour Chairs - Two year commitment, two person job

Coordinates all aspects of the Home & Garden Tour locations to the staffing and supervision of all committees/ workers deemed necessary for a successful event.

**Acquisitions** - This job entails selection of appropriate properties for the upcoming Tour based on factors such as home/garden interest, traffic flow, parking, safety and walkability.

**Logistics** - Works not only with head hostesses but trains all other hostesses in the important duties of their job. They are also in close contact with homeowners and Tour chairs in setting specific dates. Present for Head Hostess meetings at Hudson Library. Prepare Head Hostess folders. They are also in close contact with homeowners/tour chairs in setting specific dates, job includes scriptwriting, ordering and placing and removing booties/mats/gear/plaques. Update large signs with Tour dates to prep for placement by Traffic.

**Publicity** - This committee is responsible for all Tour related public relations as well as print and media advertising, Social media is a very important part of this committee.

**Ticketing** - This involves presale, ticket booth on the Green and registration at the Garden Shop.

**Traffic** - Works closely with City and Tour Chairs to design route map, and provides volunteers to assure the safety of all guests. Signs placed on edge of town, as well as no parking signs. Volunteers at each home to direct traffic and control parking.

**Garden Shop** - Purchases all flowers, plants and garden accessories to be sold to the public during the Tour. Gathers volunteers and trains on cashier duties, prep and tear down. May handle raffle item.

Hospitality/Tea Room - Solicits cookie donations, operates and staffs complimentary Tea at the middle school.

**Program** - Advertising sales, work with our printer on layout and page count, gather checks and make sure ads are submitted on time and in proper format.
