


President's Message

We will be making kits ahead of time which will later be filled with flax seed and soothing lavender as well as other comforting herbs to choose from. These soothing herbal wraps are designed to be heated in the microwave for a deep, moist heat or chilled in the freezer for cooling relief.

We did this project in December 2005 and are bringing it back by popular demand. These wraps are made to be used on all parts of your body, not just your neck, and are a perfect gift for the upcoming holidays and to keep you warm and toasty on the cold nights ahead.

Smithers Oasis Field Trip

Fifteen HGC members came out for the tour of the Smithers Oasis plant in Kent, Ohio. Without exception, fifteen members had one very informative and enjoyable morning.

You would never believe how interesting the production and resultant use of those little green blocks proved to be and how much technology is key to the process. We were given an overview of the beginnings of Oasis, who their customers are and the various uses of the product.

We saw first hand the green ooze leave the mixture machine, expanding in front of our eyes, as it traveled down the conveyor belt rising in the shape of a huge banana bread. After sitting for one day, the large block of Oasis makes its way down another conveyor belt and is trimmed and cut into long bars that are cut once more, stamped with the logo, boxed and shipped to market.



The tour culminated in our return to the test lab where we were greeted with the makings for carnation pumpkins. What fun that was. The ladies jumped right in and after a little direction fifteen orange carnation pumpkins appeared. Yes, Oasis also comes in a round shape. We were given a "goodie" bag of

information and sample products and we all headed for home, chattering about what a great time we had.
