OCTOBER FIELD TRIP Tuesday, October 16, 2012 Smithers Oasis Factory

On Tuesday, October 16, 2012 we are invited to visit the Smithers Oasis Factory in Kent, Ohio. Fifty eight years ago Akron Rubber Testing Laboratory owner Vernon Smithers opened a new business — to design, manufacture and promote a new product for florists. This new product, "solid water" for arranging flowers, was called Oasis Floral Foam. Today this enterprise spans the globe with twenty operating units where Oasis Floral Foam and several thousand other decorating articles are made. Florists and flower arrangers of all levels use these products to make their job more efficient and creative. The Smithers Oasis factory is located at 919 Marvin Avenue, Kent, Ohio 44240.

Charlie and April Walton have arranged a special tour for us to see the manufacture of Oasis Floral Foam and the line of complimentary floral arranging products. The tour will last from 10am to 12pm noon. Gardener to Gardener November Program—Date and Location for this event to be provided in November newsletter

We will plant and learn about the beauty of amaryllis flowers and how to get the most out of this showy and foolproof bulb year after year. Colorblends Flowerbulbs, HGC's source for the alliums we planted in the Community Garden across from the BP station, will be our source of huge amaryllis bulbs. All bulbs will produce at least two stems and most stems yield four flowers, sometimes more! It can take up to 12 weeks from potting to bloom, so planting in November will bring us beauty in late January or early February just when we'll need it before spring comes. Chose between two bulbs:

"Flamenco Queen" with big white blooms brushed and stippled with red



or "Rilona" with huge apricot flowers



Two on a mantel or sideboard are lovely and the blooms can be cut for use in flower arrangements. And maybe you would like a few more to pot to give to shut-in friends or as hostess gifts during the Holiday Season. Bulb, potting soil and plastic flower pot will be provided. You may bring your own pots if you wish. Cost is \$10 per bulb. You may order bulbs even if you are unable to attend the day of planting.

As fall winds down and winter approaches, gardeners need to address some basic maintenance that will make their work in the spring much easier. This presentation explains the basic chores for preparing for winter. Topics covered will include lawns, roses, evergreens and shrubs, flower beds, vegetable gardens, containers and tools.

Christine Harris has been a gardener since she was a small child. Prior to her retirement in 2004 she taught social studies at Shaw High School for 25 years and served as an Assistant Principal both there and later at Chardon High School. Since becoming a Master Gardener in 2005 Christine was in charge of the volunteers at the Shaker North Union Farmer's Market.
