#### **HERB GROUP**

Wednesday, December 3, 2014 North Meeting Room—Hudson Library

The Holiday season is now upon us, but we still need to take a little time to "smell the herbs." We sometimes forget that the nose is just as important as the eyes in gardening. Think about what happens to you as you walk into a spring garden that has lilacs in bloom. First you notice the colors of the lilacs, but as you get closer, it is the sweet smell of the lilacs that stays in your memory for years to come. In the spring, after being cooped up in the stale house during the winter months, our noses run wild for any scent that we can find in our gardens. But as the year progresses, we change from the sweet smells to the visual colors and leave behind our noses for scents such as a newly cut lawn or what we may have cooking on the grill.

We have chosen two wonderful and fragrant herbs to share with you this month. They will both delight your senses with their fragrance and with the flavor they add to many types of recipes, a few that we will have for sampling.

We will start off with Pelargoniums — commonly referred to as "Scented Geraniums." Many of you have grown them during the summer but don't necessarily bring them in to overwinter.

Dorothy Malpass will be bringing in two large rose-scented geraniums to demonstrate how to propagate and everyone interested will take home cuttings and directions on types, growing, using, overwintering and propagating.

Handouts will include how to grow and care for them along with recipes and we will be treating your taste buds with some goodies made using both the scented geranium and our second fragrant herb, lemon verbena.

The charm of lemon verbena is apparent to anyone who encounters it. It can be a neat bush if kept tightly groomed or its stems can extend into quite a sprawl. The leaves are a cheery shade of light green. But the great joy of lemon verbena is the sweet, lemony scent that leaps from the leaves at the lightest touch. This fragrance is especially strong at the peak of growth in mid to late summer.

The most common home use of the herb is in potpourri, the dried leaves can retain their scent for years and they are commonly available whole or powdered, from suppliers of potpourri ingredients. Tea made from the dried leaves is a delicious lemony beverage, thought by some to be the best of the lemon-herb teas.
