HGC DECORATES STAN HYWET DINING ROOM FOR FALL

For four days, October 2-5, 2014, HGC provided an original floral design in the dining room of Stan Hywet Hall. Featuring flowers, foliage and plant material from our members' gardens, the design was actually three arrangements in sterling silver pieces with spiraled greenery reaching out from the arrangements to each end of the table. The design interpreted the 2014 estate theme of the Seiberling family's travels with a twist — our design was titled "There's No Place Like Home" as we imagined the family back home in Autumn after traveling, enjoying a wonderful meal and conversation about their trips.

The center arrangement, made on a silver lazy susan, featured the colors yellow, orange, green and white. At its center was a large green and white striped Cushaw pumpkin surrounded by an autumn wreath of dahlias, gourds, jack-be-little mini pumpkins, osage oranges, milkweed seedpods, bittersweet, wire vine, clematis paniculata, and lamb's ear foliage. On each side were footed silver compotes with lush arrangements of purple toad lilies, bright yellow popcorn plant, dahlias of every color, cherry pink and orange digiplexis, purple beauty berries, feverfew, ageratum, hydrangea, amsonia foliage, white cleome, purple angelonia, bright yellow helianthus, white boneset, cimicifuga seed heads, hakonechloa grass, milkweed pods and bittersweet. White and orange mini pumpkins, gourds and osage oranges were set on and around ten silver candlesticks within the green vinca vine foliage that spiraled to the ends of the table on each side.
