## The 2018 Grant Recipients

Willow Farms STEPSAcademy – \$2,150 to install a solar powered irrigation system for 37 garden beds and greenhouse. (STEPS is dedicated to serving individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder and related developmental delays from 2 to 23 years of age.)

Seton Catholic School – \$1,890 to create raised flower and vegetable beds on the school campus.

Evamere Elementary School – \$1,700 to provide supplies for all Kindergarten students to create their own fairy garden and learn about drainage, proper soil, selection of plants and ongoing care.

Hudson Montessori School – \$1,475 to establish an indoor growing environment to expand botanical educational opportunities through the winter.

Friends of Hudson Parks – \$1,000 to build a monarch feeding station at Cascade Park to increase the local monarch population.

East Woods Elementary School – \$1,000 to upgrade the courtyard at the school to expand student learning environment.

Hudson Library & Historical Society – \$725 toward visiting author Victoria Johnson to discuss her new book, American Eden David Hosack, Botany and Medicine in the Garden of the Early Republic.

Eagle Scout Project at McDowell Elementary School – \$700 to replace signs at the arboretum at the school with durable outdoor signs with information about each tree.

Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park – \$500 toward scholarships for attendees to outdoor programs who would otherwise not have funds available.

Hale Farm and Village – \$400 toward the new Gatehouse Welcome Center at Hale Farm.

Hudson Montessori School – \$360 to fund beehive project, from which the students make and sell honey and other products.

Walsh Jesuit High School – \$350 to expand new monarch butterfly garden at the school.

Terex Island – \$250 to beautify and maintain the traffic island at Terex and Barlow Roads
