Garden Gathering A Repeat Success





FACTS ABOUT DADDY LONGLEGS

Daddy longlegs (a.k.a. Harvestmen) are not spiders, although they both have eight legs and belong to the same class. Spiders are exclusively predators, they have venom glands and mouthparts that are designed for a liquid diet. Daddy longlegs have no venom glands and their mouthparts allow them to consume both solid and liquid foods. Some species are meat eaters while others are omnivores eating whatever comes their way.
