We are happy to bring back the popular Amaryllis bulbs for Christmas gift-giving and/or planting at our **November General Meeting on Thursday, November 17th**. Barb Earnhardt will be sharing information and assisting with the planting.

Thank you to all who have already ordered. The Amaryllis bulbs have now arrived. We have to preorder them in late summer to avoid supplier

sellout. The bulbs are from the Netherland Bulb Company - the same company used by Suncrest Gardens and many others. We sell them to you at cost, so they are at a great savings.

This is the time of year for giving and sharing and these are a perfect way to brighten your house (a treat to yourself), give to family and friends and great hostess gifts! When they bloom they are spectacular! All Amaryllis are top size bulbs, 32-34 cm.

We still have a selection of bulbs left. Information on available bulbs are listed below. ORDER NOW FOR BEST SELECTION IF YOU HAVEN'T ORDERED ALREADY!

For those who pre-ordered Amaryllis bulbs (with or without soil), the following supplies will be available at the meeting:

- Preordered bulbs,
- Coffee filters (provided for bottom of pots),
- Pre-ordered soil (also some available for purchase),
- A small supply of leftover pots...but please plan on bringing your own pot(s).

I will be out of town so all the pre-orders and extra bulbs and soil will be at Barb Earnhardt's after November 5th.


